

# Paper Piece Chatelaine #01

## Basting the Shapes

Choose three contrasting colors #1, #2 and #3 and baste the shapes in the colors shown.

Shape	Size	Qty	Color
Half Hexagon	1-1/4"	6	#1
Half Hexagon	1-1/4"	6	#2
Hexagon	1-1/4"	2	#3

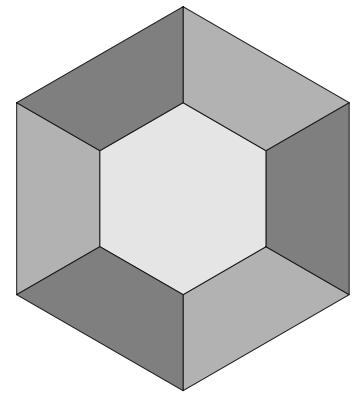

## Making the Top and Bottom

Whip stitch six basted half hexagons around one hexagon as shown in Figure 1. Do the same to make the back.

## Scissors

Take a 1/4" to 1/2" ribbon and tie it to a pair of scissors as shown in Figure 2. Tie a knot on the opposite end of the ribbon.

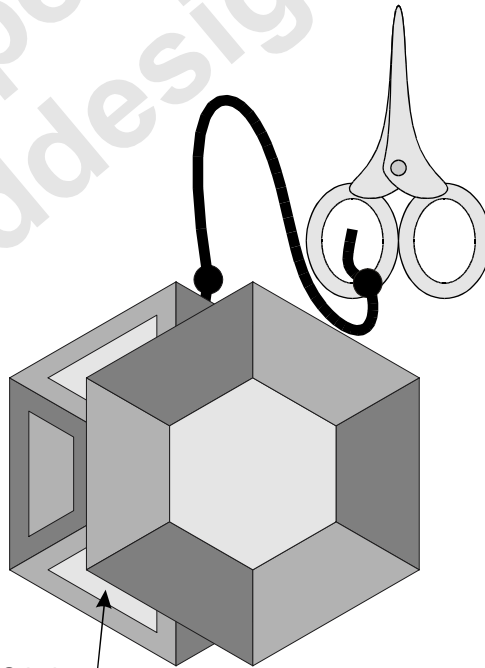

## Closing the Chatelaine

Remove all the paper pieces. Save your paper pieces to be reused.

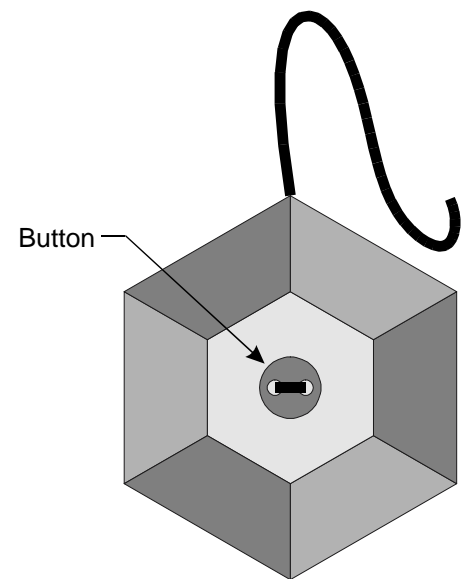

Pin the front and back together. Place the ribbon, with the scissors, at the top with the knot inside. Start whip stitching as shown in Figure 2. Stitch up and around the edge, leaving a 2" opening along the bottom edge. Stuff the chatelaine with fiber and close up the opening.

## Adding the buttons

Sew one button to each side. Run your thread thru the center of the chatelaine as show in Figure 3.

Your chatelaine is ready to be used!

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
